The Whistler House Museum of Art is pleased to announce an exhibition of works by the artist members of the Lowell Art Association Inc. (LAA) as part of our **2016 Juried Members Exhibition: Kingdom Animalia**.

Earlier this year, the WHMA invited its members to submit artworks based on the theme "Kingdom Animalia". We required that all works of art contain an animal of some kind, such as dogs, cats, birds, fish, wild and domestic animals, etc. Works submitted included oils, acrylics, watercolors, pen and ink, graphite, pastels, sculpture, photography, and fiber art.

The Whistler House Museum of Art, located in Lowell, Massachusetts, is the historic

birthplace of the famous American artist, James McNeill Whistler. Established in 1878 as the Lowell Art Association Inc., it is the oldest incorporated art association in the United States. The WHMA is known internationally for its distinguished collection of

19th and early 20th century New England representational art, including works by Whistler, Gorky, and Sargent. The historic home hosts many exhibits, lectures, concerts, educational and community programs, and an array of social events in the residence, Parker Gallery, and adjoining Victorian park.
