He is a recipient of a Fulbright
Research Grant, Artist Resource Trust
Grant, and two Mass Cultural Council
Artist Fellowships. His work is
included in the permanent collections
of the DeCordova Museum, Boston
Public Library, Fidelity Investments of
Boston, and many private collections.
Mishol is also a co-founder of the Arts
Research Collaborative in Lowell, MA.

"It was my pleasure to work with the Whistler House Museum of Art on the *Annual Juried Members Exhibition 2024*," says Stephen Mishol. "From the observed to the invented, the works juried reflect a wide range of interests and approaches, collectively embracing visual language's continuing relevance as a means for expression. Mishol juried over 130 submissions from artist members of the Lowell Art Association, Inc., judging entries on such criteria as technique, composition, perspective, color, and originality.

The WHMA is known internationally for its distinguished collection of 19th and early 20th century New England representational art, including works by Whistler, Gorky, and Sargent. The historic home hosts many exhibits, lectures, concerts, educational and community programs, and an array of social events in the residence, Parker Gallery, and adjoining Whistler Park.
