**September 29 from 1 to 3 pm** in the Parker Gallery.

This fall, the various disciplines of these talented artists are coming together for the exhibition, ***Creative Fusion: The Brush at The Whistler***. The show will be juried and curated by The Whistler House curatorial staff. Together, The Whistler House Museum of Art and The Brush Artists will showcase creatively distinctive works that represent the thriving artistic community of Lowell.

*The Whistler House Museum of Art, located in Lowell, Massachusetts, is the historic birthplace of the famous American artist, James McNeill Whistler. Established in 1878 as the Lowell Art Association Inc., it is the oldest incorporated art association in the United States. The WHMA is known internationally for its distinguished collection of 19th and early 20th century New England representational art, including works by Whistler, Gorky, and Sargent. The historic home hosts many exhibits, lectures, concerts, educational and community programs, and an array of social events in the residence, Parker Gallery, and adjoining Victorian park. Hours are Wednesday through Saturday from 11 am - 4 pm.*

*The Brush Art Gallery and Studios is located in the Lowell National Historical Park across the courtyard from the Visitor Center. This dynamic and captivating place was originally founded by the Lowell Historic Preservation Commission, U.S. Department of the Interior. Artists occupy studio spaces to interact with and educate the public on a weekly basis. Currently, nine studio artists produce paintings, illustration, photography, jewelry, sculpture, ceramics, quilts, and handwoven items. Associate artists display work in the common area. The Brush is supported by the Lowell National Historical Park and Eastern National. Hours from April 1st to December 31st are Tuesday through Saturday 11 am - 4 pm and Sunday 12 pm - 4 pm.*
